

GERMANTOWN AVENUE PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS PROJECT



PROJECT OVERVIEW:



The Germantown Avenue Pedestrian Crossings Project is a project designed to improve walkability and pedestrian safety within the neighborhood commercial corridor along Germantown Avenue between Tulpehocken and Durham Streets. The project seeks to address the lack of safe crosswalks and crossing locations for residents, shoppers and other visitors travelling to businesses and other destinations within this area.

PROJECT TEAM/FUNDING:

The project is being implemented by the City Streets Department and is funded by the City of Philadelphia Commerce Department as part of the City's investments in neighborhood commercial corridors.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS:

Proposed improvements include the following:

- Germantown Avenue crosswalk improvements at 8 intersections, including ADA ramps and bumpouts
- Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB) at unsignalized intersections (picture shown is at Duval Street)

SCHEDULE:

Design for possible improvements began in 2021. Final Design will be completed in early 2023, and construction is expected to begin in the same year, depending on the availability of construction funding.
